2. Two letters of recommendation from non-family members. These should be originals, not form letters. One letter should be from a teacher who is familiar with the applicant. The other letter can be from school staff, employer, family friend, etc., anyone not related to the applicant. Both letters of recommendation should address the applicant's attributes such as character, citizenship, achievements, extracurricular activities, community service, leadership, etc. and **give specific examples. 20 points**

3. An autobiographical summary (Times {12} font) of your accomplishments, honors, extracurricular school activities, work experience, community service, etc. Additionally, please provide a couple of paragraphs of interests, hobbies, career ambition, major, etc. Anything someone would find interesting about you. 20 points

4. Your official high school transcript to date with GPA, class rank, and if available SAT/ACT scores. 20 points
